

### **Convention 2026 to focus on Senior Cycle Redevelopment, teacher stress / workload, and lack of IT resources**

**K**ey motions at ASTI Annual Convention 2026 will highlight teachers' Senior Cycle Redevelopment concerns, including the authentication of students' Additional Assessment Components (AACs).

Under the Senior Cycle Redevelopment Programme, nine new and revised subject specifications commenced in schools for fifth years in September. Remaining subjects will be rolled out over the coming years. All new and revised subjects include an AAC worth a minimum of 40% of a student's Leaving Cert grade. The ASTI is working to achieve improved resources and measures for schools and teachers in order to address issues such as:

- the use of artificial intelligence (AI) in Leaving Certificate AACs, including authentication issues,
- the reported lack of adequate laboratory storage space/ laboratory equipment for AAC projects,
- concerns that implementing students' laboratory-based research investigations (required as part of Leaving Cert science AACs) will give rise to health and safety risks,
- teacher workload issues and lack of professional time, and
- concerns about assessment loads for students as more and more AACs (worth 40% of overall grades) are rolled out.

Investment in second-level education will also dominate Convention with two motions calling for significantly increased IT resourcing, including the provision of laptops for Senior Cycle students to enable them to navigate the new Senior Cycle Redevelopment Programme effectively.

#### **Teacher workload and stress**

Teacher workload and stress will also feature strongly at ASTI Convention 2026. One motion demands that the ASTI negotiate with the Department of Education and Youth regarding the establishment of an independent and mandatory audit of stressors and psychosocial hazards in schools. Another motion demands that the ASTI seek a reduction in the number of inspections and models of inspections for schools, in order to alleviate teacher workload and associated stress.

#### **Terms and conditions**

Terms and conditions motions cover cost of living increases, Croke Park hours, and the need for flexible parental leave arrangements akin to arrangements elsewhere in the public sector.



Dr Pia O'Farrell is a member of CREATE and an Assistant Professor of Education in the area of assessment based in the School of Policy and Practice in Dublin City University. Her research focuses on the assessment of mental health in educational settings, as well as occupational wellbeing and its implications for policy and practice. She has extensive experience in the education sector.

Dr Sabrina Fitzsimons is Co-Director of CREATE. Her research focuses on educators' occupational well-being, particularly burnout, rustout and flourishing among educators in Ireland and the UK. In addition to a strong academic publication record in peer-reviewed journals, her research has been featured on *RTÉ Drivetime*, in the *Huffington Post*, *The Conversation*, *The Irish Psychologist*, *The Psychologist (BPS)*, and other media outlets.

Professor Catherine Furlong is Co-Director of CREATE at Dublin City University where she also serves as Chair of the BEd and MEd programmes, providing academic leadership in initial and postgraduate teacher education. She lectures in the areas of Leadership, Governance and Policy. Her research focuses on teacher education, educational leadership, and the development of research-informed practice.

# CONVENTION MOTIONS 2026

## ASSESSMENT

### MOTION 37 - ASSESSMENT

That the ASTI demand all work undertaken by teachers in relation to Additional Assessment Components be covered by full indemnity. **(Carbery)**

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### MOTION 39 - ASSESSMENT

That the ASTI demand that students be solely responsible for the authentication and submission of the completed AAC to the State Examinations Commission. **(Dublin North 1 Miriam Duggan)**

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### MOTION 42 - ASSESSMENT

That the ASTI adopt the position that all aspects of senior cycle assessment should remain the responsibility of the State Examinations Commission. That the ASTI direct teachers not to engage in any scheduling, administering, supervising, authenticating, collecting, storing or correcting of the additional assessment component associated with the senior cycle redevelopment. **(Dublin South County) (Requires a Ballot)**

## MOTION 38 - ASSESSMENT

That the ASTI demand that one CBA per subject be required to be completed only, as part of the Junior Cycle curriculum. **(Dublin North 1 Miriam Duggan)**

That ASTI negotiate with the Department and its Inspectorate to oppose the introduction of common level classes in 2nd year core subjects of English, Irish and Maths. **(Sligo)**
