Elect ASTI members to the Teaching Council

Vote online February 24 - March 11

The term of office of the current Teaching Council comes to an end in April 2020. In advance of that date, elections for a new Teaching Council will be held from February 24th to March 11th.

The Teaching Council elections will be held online and all teachers registered on or before September 30th 2019 will receive a letter with voting instructions.

The ASTI has endorsed a number of teachers who are members of the ASTI to run in the Teaching Council elections.

The Teaching Council, which was established in 2006, is the regulatory body for teachers and its objectives include upholding standards in the teaching profession and in the professional development of teachers, and promoting the status of the teaching profession.

The Teaching Council is made up of 37 members, the majority of whom are serving teachers. Of 22 places reserved on the Council for registered teachers, six are nominated by the teacher unions (ASTI, TUI and INTO nominate two teachers each) and the remaining sixteen are elected by teachers. Seven teachers are elected by second-level teachers. See page 4 for electoral categories and constituencies.

ASTI endorsed candidates

The ASTI endorses candidates running in the second-level Teaching Council election constituencies. ASTI endorsed candidates are ASTI members who have applied for and received endorsement using criteria set down by ASTI Standing Committee.

ASTI endorsed candidates have committed to promoting the interests of ASTI members if elected.

Inadequate in-service, both in timing and quality by the JCT, increasing difficulty in delivering the new Junior Cycle programme as desired. I would like to see priority given to the intent of the above Teaching Council statement. I want the Teaching Council to actively engage with teachers, so that teachers feel they are getting some value for the money they pay to the Teaching Council each year.
